

No. 730. THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAW, 1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2729

MADE UNDER SECTION 106.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 106 of the Customs Management Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Exportation of Certain Goods (Restriction) Order, 1954.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“animal” means any animal or animals other than cats, dogs and poultry ;

“Chief Veterinary Officer” means the Chief Veterinary Officer to the Government of the Colony of Cyprus and includes any person acting under his instructions ;

“port lairage” means any premises which are or have been approved in writing by the Chief Veterinary Officer for the keeping of animals under observation prior to exportation.

3. The exportation of all animals is prohibited save under a Health Certificate issued by the Chief Veterinary Officer.

4. All animals intended for export shall be kept under observation in a port lairage for a period of not less than twenty-four hours prior to the issue of a Health Certificate.

5. The Chief Veterinary Officer may prohibit the admission to a port lairage of any animal which in his opinion is affected, or is suspected to be affected, by any contagious or infectious disease.

6. Any animal on entering or leaving a port lairage may be branded or marked in such manner as the Chief Veterinary Officer may from time to time determine.

7. Every Health Certificate shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule hereto.

8. There shall be charged and paid for every Health Certificate, before the issue thereof, the fees appearing in the Second Schedule hereto.

9. There shall be charged and paid for lairage of animals kept under observation in a port lairage prior to exportation the fees appearing in the Third Schedule hereto.

10. No Health Certificate shall be issued unless—

(a) the animal to which the Health Certificate relates has been kept under observation as prescribed in paragraph 4 hereof ;

(b) such animal has remained healthy during the period prescribed in paragraph 4 hereof ;

(c) such animal has not during the period aforesaid been in contact with any animal affected, or suspected to be affected, by any contagious or infectious disease ;

(d) the fees herein prescribed in respect of such Health Certificate have been paid ; and

(e) the fees herein prescribed in respect of the lairage of such animal in a port lairage have been paid.

11. The exportation to the United Kingdom of the goods appearing in the first column to the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be subject to the restrictions appearing against each item respectively in the second column of the said Schedule.
