

No. 129. THE SECONDARY EDUCATION LAW.
CAP. 205 AND LAWS 5 OF 1950, 18 OF 1952 AND 20 OF 1954.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTIONS 33 AND 34 (1) (m).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 33 and 34 (1) (m) of the Secondary Education Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Secondary Education (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Secondary Education Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2.—(1) Regulation 24 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following regulation substituted therefor :—

“ 24.—(1) The grades and salary scales payable to teachers appointed to the permanent and pensionable staff shall be those set out in the Tenth Appendix to these Regulations, and every such teacher shall be placed by the Director on the grade appropriate to the teacher's qualifications, and at such point on the scale as the Director may decide, having regard to the teacher's previous experience of teaching :

Tenth Appendix.

Provided that, with regard to any teacher who is appointed to a Public-aided Secondary School, the Director may accept—

(a) the ability and attainment of the teacher as equivalent to a University Degree ;

(b) the efficiency in, and experience of, teaching as equivalent to Teacher Training,

as set out in the said Appendix.

(2) Teachers who are not natives of the Colony, or who, though natives of the Colony, are not British subjects, shall be appointed on contract, and on successful completion of contract, or on retirement, may be paid a gratuity in accordance with the Regulations set out in the First Schedule to the Secondary Education Law.

(3) Temporary teachers shall be paid a salary at the direction of the Director”.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1952.

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the First Appendix thereto and the substitution therefor of the following First Appendix :—

(a) by the substitution for paragraph 1 thereof of the following paragraph :—

“1. Salaries and allowances of teachers in Public-aided Secondary Schools shall be as follows :—

“2. A cost of living allowance may, with the approval of the Governor, be paid to teachers in Public-aided Secondary Schools at such rates as may, from time to time, be determined by the Governor.” ;

(c) by the deletion of paragraph 5 thereof.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1953.

8.—(1) The Secondary Education (Public-aided Secondary Schools) Regulations, 1952 (set out in the Second Schedule to the Secondary Education (Amendment) Law, 1952, and as amended by the Secondary Education (Public-aided Secondary Schools) (Amendment) Regulations, 1952, and by section 6 of the Secondary Education (Amendment) Law, 1954), are hereby revoked.

(2) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1954.
