## NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 29 (1).

Cap. 259. In exercise of the powers vested in him by sub-section (1) of section 29 of the Evcaf Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the sanction of the Secretary of State, has been pleased to declare the offices in the Evcaf Department set out in the First Schedule hereto to be pensionable as from the date of the publication of this Notification in the *Gazette*, and has further been pleased to declare the offices in the Evcaf Department set out in the Second Schedule hereto to be pensionable, and to be deemed to have been pensionable as from the 1st day of January, 1945, and for such period that the said offices set out in the said Second Schedule are held by the persons who hold them on the date of the publication of this notification in the *Gazette*.

2. All previous notifications made under the above-mentioned section of the Evcaf Law are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done, or left undone, and without prejudice to any pension right accrued, thereunder.

## THE SHEEP AND GOATS (SHEPHERDS' LICENSING AND CONTROL) LAW.

CAP. 157.

## NOTICE UNDER SECTION 12.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 12 of the Sheep and Goats (Shepherds' Licensing and Control) Law, Cap. 157, I hereby direct that during the period between the 15th April, and 31st July, 1955, flocks within the village area of Eylenja, Nicosia District, shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, be kept inside an enclosure:

Provided that nothing in this notice contained shall prevent the driving of any flock, under the proper charge of a licensed shepherd, from one village area to another, along any public road, at any hour.
