No. 296. THE BOATS REGULATION LAW.
CAP. 268.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 8.

In exercise of the powers vested in him under section 8 of the Boats Regulations Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make Cap. 268. the following regulations :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Boats (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Boats Regulations (hereinafter S.L. I. 600. referred to as “ the principal Regulations ”).

2. Regulations 18 and 19 of the principal Regulations are hereby revoked and the following regulations substituted therefor :—

“ 18. Every owner and every boatman in charge of a licensed boat shall at all times specified in the First Appendix hereto, convey any passengers and any baggage belonging to such passengers from any vessel lying in the anchorage in any port in the Colony to the landing stage in such port, or vice versa, at rates not exceeding those set forth in the said Appendix. First Appendix.

19.—(1) No person in charge of a licensed boat shall demand or receive, or employ any other person to demand or receive, any sum on account of fares other than those prescribed in Parts I or II, as the case may be, of the First Appendix hereto.

(2) Charges becoming payable under Part II of the First Appendix hereto in respect of passengers transported, as in regulation 18 provided, shall be included in the cost of any ocean passage ticket in which Larnaca or Limassol, as the case may be, are shown as the port of disembarkation or of embarkation, and shall be payable by the agent of the vessel at the

port of disembarkation or embarkation, respectively, at or from which a passenger disembarks or embarks, to the owner or person in charge of the licensed boat by which they are disembarked or embarked :

Provided that—

- (a) nothing in Part I of the said Appendix contained shall apply in any case where the provisions of Part II thereof apply ;
- (b) charges payable under Part I of the said Appendix shall include transfer of the passenger's baggage from the place of accommodation in the vessel and delivery into the Customs baggage office at the port of disembarkation, or vice versa ;
- (c) charges payable under Part II of the said Appendix shall include transfer of passenger's baggage from the place of accommodation in the vessel, through Customs inspection and on to vehicle outside Customs gate, or vice versa."

3. The First Appendix to the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following Appendix substituted therefor :—

“ FIRST APPENDIX.

(Regulations 18 and 19).

RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR THE DISEMBARKATION OR EMBARKATION OF PASSENGERS AND BAGGAGE WITHIN THE LIMITS OF PORTS IN THE COLONY.

PART I.

- (a) Between the hours of 5 a.m. and 8 p.m. during the months of April to October inclusive, and between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. during the months of November to March inclusive, in every year :—

- (b) Outside the hours specified in paragraph (a) hereof :—at double the rates specified therein.

- (c) At any time during weather conditions which, in the opinion of the Superintendent of the Port, are such as to justify charges in excess of those specified in paragraphs (a) or (b) hereof, at such rates as the Superintendent of the Port may approve.

PART II.

At the ports of Larnaca and Limassol, respectively, the charge for passengers holding tickets for ocean-travel by a foreign-going vessel, other than a sailing vessel, transported to or from such vessel shall be as follows :—

Limassol :

Each adult	15s.
Each child from 2 to 12 years old	7s. 4½p.
Each child under 2 years old	Free

Larnaca :

Each adult	16 0
Each child from 2 to 12 years old	7 6
Each child under 2 years old	Free."

4. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1955.
