No. 371. THE SPECIAL CONSTABLES LAW, 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 2 of the Special Constables Law, 1952, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations :-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Cyprus Special Constables (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus Special Constables Regulations, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Cyprus Special Constables Regulations, 1952 and 1955.

2. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution therein for the words "twenty-five" (line 4) of the words "twenty-one".
