Whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that in order to preserve the amenities of certain ancient monuments in the Old Town, Famagusta, that is to say the ruins of the churches respectively set out as items 30 and 31 of the Famagusta District in the First Schedule to the Antiquities Law, it is desirable that no buildings should be erected in the proximity of such ancient monuments upon the plot of land described in the Schedule hereto and that any buildings thereon should be demolished :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 12 of the Antiquities Law, I, the Governor, do hereby direct that the property described in the Schedule hereto be acquired on payment of such amount by way of compensation as may be agreed upon between the Commissioner of Famagusta and the owners of the said property and that in default of agreement within one month from the date hereof the amount of compensation be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition Law.
