## THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAW, 1954. No. 476.

## REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 232.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 232 of the Customs Management Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice 8 of 1954. of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regu-

I. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Management Gazettes: (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1955 and shall be read as one with the Customs Management Regulations, 1954 and 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Customs Management Regulations, 1954 to 1955.

2. The Schedule to the principal Regulations, as amended by the Customs Management (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, is hereby further Supplement amended by the deletion therefrom of that part thereof from the beginning up to, but excluding, the part thereof under the heading "Conditions and Exemptions", and by the substitution therefor of the following:--
