**BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF LEFKA.**

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law and of every other power thereunto enabling the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Lefka hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Lefka Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Lefka Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Lefka Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to 1955.

2. Sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h) of paragraph (1) of bye-law 19 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby deleted and the following sub-paragraphs substituted therefor :—

- "(a) For every cow, ox or camel not exceeding 30 okes in weight .. .. . 300 mils
- (b) For every cow, ox or camel exceeding 30 okes in weight .. .. . 500 "
- (c) For every kid or lamb or goat or sheep not exceeding 6 okes in weight .. .. . 100 "
- (d) For every goat or sheep of any age exceeding 6 okes in weight .. .. . 200 "
- (e) For any pig of any age if not exceeding 5 okes in weight 50 "
- (f) For every pig of any age exceeding 5 okes but not exceeding 30 okes in weight .. .. . 300 "
- (g) For every pig of any age exceeding 30 okes but not exceeding 60 okes in weight .. .. . 400 "
- (h) For every pig of any age exceeding 60 okes in weight.. 600 .."

3. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 29 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

"29.—(1) The following tolls shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or person in charge of the following goods brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market :—

- (a) Vegetables, fruits and all other marketable commodities or articles or things not specifically enumerated below—
  - (i) For each large or small basket (kalathion) .. 18 mils
  - (ii) For each receptacle not exceeding 30 okes in weight gross .. .. . 33 "
  - (iii) For each receptacle not exceeding 60 okes in weight gross .. .. . 50 "
  - (iv) For each receptacle exceeding 60 okes in weight gross, in addition to the above toll of 50 mils, a further toll of 11 mils for every 10 okes or part thereof in excess.
- (b) Oil—
  - (i) For every kouza or demijohn or tin.. .. 50 "
  - (ii) For every skin .. .. . 68 "
- (c) Lime or gypsum : for every load of 60 okes or part thereof .. .. . 23 .."

4. Bye-law 35 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“35. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought to the Animal Market :—

- (a) For every ass, camel, horse, mule or ox . . . . . 100 mils  
 Provided that the young ones of the above-named up to 12 months old, if running loose with their mothers, shall be admitted free of charge into the Animal Market.
- (b) For every goat or sheep . . . . . 25 „
- (c) For every kid or lamb under three months . . . . . 18 „”

5. Bye-law 41 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“41. Every person selling fresh fish shall pay to the Inspector of the Municipal Market a toll of 5 mils for every oke or part thereof.”

6. Sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) of paragraph (1) of bye-law 61 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby deleted and the following sub-paragraphs substituted therefor :—

- “(a) For each large or small basket (kalathion) . . . . . 18 mils
- (b) For each receptacle not exceeding 30 okes in weight gross . . . . . 33 „
- (c) For each receptacle not exceeding 60 okes in weight gross . . . . . 50 „
- (d) For each receptacle exceeding 60 okes in weight gross, in addition to the above toll of 50 mils, a further toll of 11 mils for every 10 okes or part thereof in excess.
- (e) For every hare, or every pair of partridges or other wild birds of about the size of partridges.. . . . 10 „
- (f) For every dozen of beccaficoes or other birds of about that size . . . . . 10 „”

7. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 76 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“76.—(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Third Schedule to these bye-laws, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of 3 mils for every 10 okes in respect thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that—

- (a) for fractions under 3 mils 3 mils shall be collected ;
- (b) for fractions over 3 mils, and under 5 mils the sum of 5 mils shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 3 mils.”

8. The Third Schedule to the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following Schedule substituted therefor :—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that—

- (a) for fractions under 3 mils the sum of 3 mils shall be collected;
- (b) for fractions over 3 mils and under 5 mils the sum of 5 mils shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 3 mils."

9. Bye-law 81 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

"81.—(1) There shall be paid to the Town Clerk and Treasurer in every year by any person keeping any of the following places or buildings the fee determined by the Council within the limits set out against each such place or building, that is to say :—

The fee shall be in respect of the period commencing on the 31st December of each year irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable.

(2) The amount of every such fee shall be determined in each case by the Council."

10. Sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g) of paragraph (1) of bye-law 123 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby deleted and the following sub-paragraphs substituted therefor :—

- "(a) For every bucket or receptacle of night soil from a private house : For a period of one year .. .. . 2000 mils
- (b) For all buckets or receptacles of night soil or fluid refuse used by the place : For a period of one month .. .. . 3750 "
- (c) For all buckets or receptacles of night soil or fluid refuse used by the personnel of the Lefka Konak : For a period of one month .. .. . 3000 "

- (d) For all buckets or receptacles of night soil or fluid refuse from any ecclesiastical or religious or other public institution or hotel : For a period of one month .. 1000 mils
- (e) For every bucket or receptacle of fluid refuse from a private house : For a period of one year .. .. 1500 ,,
- (f) For every bucket or receptacle of fluid refuse from any shop : For a period of one year .. .. . 1000 ,,
- (g) For every bucket or receptacle of night soil or fluid refuse from any premises not enumerated above : For a period of one year .. .. . 1200 ,, ”

11. Bye-law 135 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 135. Every person requiring any town water to be conveyed from the main to his premises or building or place shall pay in advance a fee of 1000 mils.”

12. Bye-law 171 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 171. The following fees shall be paid to the Town Clerk and Treasurer by any person storing petroleum in the Municipal stores :—

- Class A or B (after one year of admission into store) per four gallons, for every month or part thereof .. 3 mils
- Class C, per ton, for every twelve months or part thereof. . 400 ,, ”

13. Sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of bye-law 190 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following sub-paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(a) The Council shall charge a duty (hereinafter called ‘entertainment duty’) on all payments made for admission to any public entertainment at the rates as hereinafter :—

- (i) On each ticket the total price of which does not exceed 28 mils .. .. . 5 mils
- (ii) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 28 mils but does not exceed 50 mils .. .. 11 ,,
- (iii) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 50 mils but does not exceed 100 mils .. .. 23 ,,
- (iv) On each ticket the total price of which exceeds 100 mils but does not exceed 150 mils .. .. 33 ,,
- (v) On each ticket the total price of which is over 150 mils .. .. . 50 ,, ”

14. Bye-law 201 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the proviso thereto (the colon occurring therein being substituted by a full stop) and the substitution of the figure and word “100 mils” for the words “two shillings” (line 2).

15. Bye-law 204 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the word “five” (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word “250 mils” and by the deletion therefrom of the proviso thereto.

16. Bye-law 211 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 211. The following charges shall be paid by every person posting or exhibiting any notice or advertisement on any hoarding, that is to say :—

17. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 213 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“ 213.—(1) Every licensee of a hotel of any class shall pay a fee of 5 mils per day or part of the day to the Municipal Clerk and Treasurer for every person of over ten years of age in respect of every night or part thereof on which such person is provided with sleeping accommodation at such hotel.”

The above Bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.

**THE HOTELS, LODGING HOUSES AND PUBLIC BUILDINGS  
(REGULATION) LAW.**

CAP. 105.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF ATHIENOU  
UNDER SECTION 4.

Whereas by Order-in-Council No. 2602 published under Notification No. 125 in Supplement, No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 12th March, 1953, the Hotels, Lodging Houses and Public Buildings (Regulation) Law has been applied to hotels, lodging houses and public buildings situated within the limits of all Municipal Corporations: Cap. 105.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in them, the Municipal Council of the Municipal Corporation of Athienou hereby make the following bye-laws:—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Hotels, Lodging Houses and Public Buildings (Athienou) Bye-laws, 1955, and shall come into operation upon their publication in the *Gazette*.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this bye-law, the Hotels, Lodging Houses and Public Buildings (Nicosia) Bye-laws, 1955, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 28th April, 1955 (hereinafter referred to as “ the model bye-laws ”), shall—

- (a) be deemed to be bye-laws made by the Municipal Council of the Municipal Corporation of Athienou and to be incorporated herein, and
- (b) apply to the hotels, lodging houses and public buildings within the Municipal limits of the Municipal Corporation of Athienou:

Provided that for the word “ Nicosia ” wherever it occurs in the model bye-laws the word “ Athienou ” shall be substituted.

(2) The bye-law set out in the First Appendix hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding bye-law of the model bye-laws.

FIRST APPENDIX.

(Bye-law 20)

It shall be the duty of the owner or person in charge of any hotel or public building to cause all food and all articles intended, exposed or offered for food or sale for human consumption to be protected from flies and other insects, dust and vermin by keeping them in well closed clean receptacles and to be handled by clean hands and by persons in possession of a valid certificate of health issued under Bye-laws 114 to 118 of the Athienou Municipal Bye-laws, 1948 to 1955, or any bye-laws amending or substituted for the same.

The above Bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.
