Notice under Section 42A (1).

Whereas it appears to me that owing to present disturbed conditions within the Colony and the insufficiency of the ordinary police officers to preserve the peace and protect the property, it is necessary that an Auxiliary Police Force should be established:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 42A (1) of the Police Law, I, the Commissioner of Police, with the approval of the Acting Governor, do hereby direct that an Auxiliary Police Force be established as from the 1st day of August, 1955, under the provisions of Part VIA of the aforesaid Law.

THE HOTELS, LODGING HOUSES AND PUBLIC BUILDINGS (REGULATION) LAW—CAP. 105.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF AKANTHOU, UNDER SECTION 4.

Whereas by Order in Council No. 2602 published under Notification No. 125 in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 12th March, 1953, the Cap. 105. Hotels, Lodging Houses and Public Buildings (Regulation) Law has been applied to hotels, lodging houses and public buildings situated within the limits of all municipal corporations.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in them, the Municipal Council of the Municipal Corporation of Akanthou hereby make the following bye-laws:-

- 1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Hotels, Lodging Houses and Public Buildings (Akanthou) Bye-laws, 1955, and shall come into operation upon their publication in the Gazette.
- 2. The Hotels, Lodging Houses and Public Buildings (Nicosia) Bye-laws, 1955, published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 28th April, 1955, shall-
 - (a) be deemed to be bye-laws made by the Municipal Council of the Municipal Corporation of Akanthou and to be incorporated herein,
 - (b) apply to the hotels, lodging houses and public buildings within the municipal limits of the Municipal Corporation of Akanthou.

The above Bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Acting Governor.
