609 No. 614. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAW. CAP. 252 AND LAWS 11 OF 1950, 31 OF 1951, 20 OF 1953, 29 OF 1954, 57 OF 1954 AND 14 OF 1955. BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF AKANTHOU. In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law, and otherwise the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Akanthou hereby make the following Bye-laws:-1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) Gazettes: (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1950 (hereinafter referred to as 18.12.1931 Supplement "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws 20.5.1948 may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) Bye-laws, 1931 to 1955. 2. Bye-law 17 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:-"17. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of, or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say:-(a) For every cow or ox mils. (i) not exceeding 30 okes in weight 150 (ii) exceeding 30 okes but not exceeding 70 okes in weight 200 (iii) exceeding 70 okes in weight (b) For every goat or sheep. (i) of less than six okes in weight (ii) of six okes in weight and over . . 3. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 27 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor: "(1) The following tolls shall be paid by the owner or the person in charge of any goods brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market:— (i) When the value of such goods does not exceed 100 mils (ii) When the value of such goods exceeds 100 mils but does not exceed 200 mils .. ., .. (iii) When the value of such goods exceeds 200 mils but does not exceed 500 mils (iv) When the value of such goods exceeds 500 mils but does not exceed 800 mils (v) When the value of such goods exceeds 800 mils but does not exceed £1 (vi) When the value of such goods exceeds one pound, a toll of 5 mils for every additional two hundred mils or part thereof shall be added to the toll of 25 mils mentioned in (v) above." 4. Bye-law 27B of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Akanthou) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1950) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:-"27B. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of or the person in charge of the following game brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market:mils.
