BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF
LEFKONIKO.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law and of every other power thereunto enabling the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Lefkoniko hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) Bye-laws, 1940 to 1953 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) Bye-laws, 1940 to 1955.

2. Bye-law 29 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 29. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the person in charge of any animal brought to the Animal Market :—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every camel, horse, mule or ox	50
(b) For every ass	25

Provided that the young ones of the above named up to 12 months old, if running loose with their mothers, shall be admitted free of charge into the Animal Market.

(c) For every pig	50
(d) For every goat or sheep	25
(e) For every pig under 3 months	25
(f) For every kid or lamb under three months	15".

3. Bye-law 33 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 33. Every person selling fresh fish shall pay to the Inspector a fee of not less than 5 mils and not more than 15 mils per oke or proportionately for lesser quantities, as the Council may from time to time prescribe."

4. Bye-law 37 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 37. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by any person selling flour in the Flour Market or elsewhere in the Municipal Market :—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every sack of less than 50 okes gross	5
(b) For every sack of 50 okes and over gross	10".

5. Bye-law 42 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 42. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of any meat brought into or exposed for sale in the Meat Market—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every ox and cow of any age—	
(i) if not exceeding 35 okes in weight	75
(ii) if 35 okes and over but not exceeding 60 okes	100
(iii) if 60 okes and over but not exceeding 100 okes	150
(iv) if 100 okes and over	200
(b) For every sheep or goat of any age—	
(i) if 6 okes in weight or less	15
(ii) if 6 okes and over but not exceeding 12 okes	25
(iii) if 12 okes and over	50".

6. Bye-law 45 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946), is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 45. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the person exposing for sale any carcass of a pig or part thereof or portion of fresh pork—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) not exceeding 40 okes in weight	150
(b) exceeding 40 okes but not exceeding 60 okes in weight	200
(c) exceeding 60 okes but not exceeding 100 okes in weight	250
(d) exceeding 100 okes.. .. .	300.”

7. Paragraphs (1) and (3) of bye-law 50 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby repealed and the following paragraphs substituted therefor :—

“ (1) The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of the following goods brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market :—

(a) Goods not specifically enumerated below, other than flour, or fresh meat, fish or pork—	<i>Mils.</i>
(i) when the value of such goods does not exceed 50 mils	5
(ii) for every additional 50 mils or part thereof ..	3
(b) Oil for every oke or part thereof	3
(c) Lime for every ton or part thereof	15
(d) Gypsum for every ton or part thereof.. .. .	15

(3) No person who is a lessee of any shed or stall or shop in the Municipal Market allotted for the sale of perishable goods shall be charged with the fees prescribed in bye-law 50 (2).”

8. Bye-law 57 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 57. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of the perishable goods brought into or on sale in the Market for Perishable Goods :—

For Game—	<i>Mils.</i>
(i) for every hare	15
(ii) for every partridge or other game	5
(iii) beccaficoes, bee-eaters, or other birds of similar size per dozen or any lesser number	5”.

9. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 75 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“ (1) The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner of, or the person slaughtering, any animal in the slaughter-house :—

(a) For every ox or cow of any age—	<i>Mils.</i>
(i) if not exceeding 40 okes in weight	150
(ii) if 40 okes and over but not exceeding 70 okes ..	200
(iii) if 70 okes and over	300
(b)—(i) For every goat or sheep of any age	85
(ii) For every kid or lamb which is slaughtered between the 1st December and the 30th April	50
(iii) For every kid or lamb which is slaughtered between the 1st May and the 30th November	85
(c) For every pig or swine of any age—	
(i) if not exceeding 40 okes in weight	100
(ii) if 40 okes and over but not exceeding 70 okes ..	150
(iii) if 70 okes and over but not exceeding 100 okes ..	200
(iv) if 100 okes and over	250”.

10. Bye-law 103 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figure and word “ 30 shillings ” (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word “ 1500 mils ”.

11. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the Second Schedule thereto (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1949) and the substitution therefor of the following Schedule :—

12. Bye-law 186 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 186. The fee to be paid to the Treasurer in respect of each licence and number-plate for a bicycle or tricycle issued by the Council shall be 100 mils: Provided that where a licence is issued after the 30th June of any year a fee of 60 mils shall be charged.”

13. Bye-law 193 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 193. The following fees shall be paid to the treasurer for exhibiting any notice or advertisement on any hoarding :—

14. Bye-law 196 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 196. There shall be paid by every licensee of a hotel of the first and second class a fee of 10 mils, of the third class a fee of 5 mils and of any other class a fee of 3 mils for every person of over 10 years of age in respect of every night or part thereof on which such person is provided with sleeping accommodation at such hotel.”

15. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 210B of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Lefkoniko) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1953) is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of 3 mils for every 10 okes or part thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the

Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that—

(a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and

(b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected:

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be five mils.”

16. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the Third Schedule thereto (as set out in the Municipal Corporation (Lefkorniko) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1953) and the substitution therefor of the following Schedule :—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that—

(a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and

(b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 5 mils ”.

**RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF MONI IN
THE LIMASSOL DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 9.**

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Moni hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Moni) Rules, 1955, and shall come into operation on their publication in the *Gazette*.
