No. 710. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW. CAP. 142.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF MONI IN THE LIMASSOL DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Moni hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Moni) Rules, 1955, and shall come into operation on their publication in the Gazette.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this rule, the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as the "Model
