

No. 711. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW.
CAP. 142.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Dhali, in the District of Nicosia, and approved by the Commissioner are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF DHALI UNDER
SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, Cap. 142, the Village Health Commission of Dhali hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Dhali) (Amendment) Rules, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Dhali) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Rules ”), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Dhali) Rules, 1938 and 1955.

2. The following rules shall be substituted for Rules 20, 32, 46 (1) and 54 (1), respectively, of the principal Rules :—

Rule 20. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of, or the person slaughtering, any animal in a slaughter-house, that is to say :—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox :—	
Not exceeding 50 okes in weight	75
Exceeding 50 okes in weight	150
(b) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep :—	
Not exceeding 7 okes in weight	50
Exceeding 7 okes in weight	75
(c) For every swine :—	
Not exceeding 50 okes in weight	150
Exceeding 50 okes but not exceeding 100 okes in weight	175
Exceeding 100 okes	250

Rule 32. The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say :—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) When the value of such goods is under 100 mils	10
(b) When the value of such goods exceeds 100 mils but does not exceed 200 mils	15
(c) When the value of such goods exceeds 200 mils but does not exceed 400 mils	25
(d) When the value of such goods exceeds 400 mils but does not exceed 750 mils	35
(e) When the value of such goods exceeds 750 mils but does not exceed £1	50
(f) When the value of such goods exceeds £1 but does not exceed £2	80
(g) When the value of such goods exceeds £2 but does not exceed £4	150

(2) If the value of such goods exceeds £4, a fee of 25 mils for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 150 mils.

(3) Every such fee shall be paid to the Inspector,

Rule 46. The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :—

	<i>Mils.</i>
(a) For every carcass of sheep, goat, lamb or kid or part thereof :—	
Not exceeding 7 okes in weight	50
Exceeding 7 okes in weight	75
(b) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof :—	
Not exceeding 50 okes in weight	100
Exceeding 50 okes in weight	200

Rule 54. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of, or the person exposing for sale, any carcass of swine or fresh pork in the pork market, that is to say :—

(a) For every carcass of swine or fresh pork or part thereof :—	<i>Mils.</i>
Not exceeding 50 okes in weight	100
Exceeding 50 okes but not exceeding 100 okes	200
Exceeding 100 okes	300

No. 712. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW.
CAP. 142.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF KHANDRIA IN THE
LIMASSOL DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Khandria hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Khandria) Rules, 1955, and shall come into operation on their publication in the *Gazette*.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this rule, the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as the “ Model Rules ”), published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th November 1952, shall—

(a) be deemed to be rules made by the Village Health Commission of Khandria and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the village of Khandria :

Provided that for the word “ Nikos ” and for the word “ Nicosia ” wherever they occur in the Model Rules, the word “ Khandria ” and the word “ Limassol ” shall be substituted respectively.

(2) The rules set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding rules of the Village (Nikos) Rules, 1952.

(3) Those rules of the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952, mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, shall not apply to the Village of Khandria.

RULES TO BE SUBSTITUTED.

Rule 19. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say :—

(a) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox	50
(b) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep	20
(c) For every swine	100
