THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW. No. 712. CAP. 142.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF KHANDRIA IN THE LIMASSOL DISTRICT UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section q of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Khandria hereby make the following rules:—

- 1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Khandria) Rules, 1955, and shall come into operation on their publication in the Gazette.
- 2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this rule, the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as the "Model Rules"), published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 19th November 1952, shall-
 - (a) be deemed to be rules made by the Village Health Commission of Khandria and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the village of Khandria:

Provided that for the word "Nikos" and for the word "Nicosia" wherever they occur in the Model Rules, the word "Khandria" and the word "Limassol" shall be substituted respectively.

- (2) The rules set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding rules of the Village (Nikos) Rules, 1952.
- (3) Those rules of the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952, mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, shall not apply to the Village of Khandria.
