THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC LAW, 1954.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Motor Vehicles Regulations, 1951 to 1954 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Motor Vehicles Regulations, 1951 to 1955. *Gazette : Supplement No. 3: 31.10.1951 9. 5.1953 16.12.1954.*
2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 10, of the following new Regulation:—
- "Vehicles resembling military or police vehicles. 10A. The Registrar may refuse to register, or may cancel the registration of, any motor vehicle which, in his opinion, so nearly resembles the colour and general appearance of a military or police vehicle as to be likely to be mistaken for any such military or police vehicle."
- Amendment of the principal Regulations by insertion of new Regulation 10A.*

THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW.

CAP. 266 AND LAW I OF 1953.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prison (Temporary Provisions) Regulations, 1955. *Cap. 266. 1 of 1953.*
2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Prison Regulations, the Governor may, if he considers it expedient so to do in the interests of maintaining discipline and order in a prison or in the public interest generally, direct the removal of a prisoner from a prison to a police prison for the purpose of serving the remainder of his sentence, or such part thereof as the Governor may direct, in such police prison. *S.L. Vol. I, p. 565.*
3. These Regulations shall remain in force for a period of one year from the date hereof and shall then expire.
