

No. 750. THE BELLS (REGULATION) LAW.
CAP. 47.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Bells (Regulation) Law, I, the Commissioner of Paphos, hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Bells (Regulation) (Paphos District) Order, 1955.

2. The bells of every church situated within the District of Paphos may be sounded or rung solely for the purposes of any divine service customarily celebrated therein or of any baptism, wedding or funeral service whenever any such service is being held or is to be held in such church.

3. On any of the occasions specified in paragraph 2 hereof, the bells of every church may be sounded or rung at such times and for such periods and as often as it has been customary heretofore either immediately before or during or immediately after any divine service customarily celebrated therein or any baptism, wedding or funeral service.

4. Nothing herein contained shall affect or shall be construed as affecting the validity of any permit relating to the sounding or ringing of bells as time signals or for summoning children to school.

THE SHEEP AND GOATS (SHEPHERDS' LICENSING AND CONTROL) LAW.
CAP. 157.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 12.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 12 of the Sheep and Goats (Shepherds' Licensing and Control) Law, I hereby direct that during the period between the 1st December, 1955, and 15th July, 1956, flocks within the area of Aradhippou, in the District of Larnaca, shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, be kept inside an enclosure and not taken outside an enclosure: Cap. 157.

Provided that nothing in this notice contained shall prevent the driving of any flock under the proper charge of a licensed shepherd, from one village area to another, along any public road, at any hour.
