THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Modification of the Coroners Law, 1953) Regulations, 1955.

23 of 1953. 2. Notwithstanding anything in the Coroners Law, 1953, to the contrary contained, where an inquest has been held by a coroner who is a member of the Special Court, the provisions of section 28 of the Coroners Law, 1953, shall not apply to any such inquest and in any such case the original of every inquisition, including the depositions and the recognisances of the witnesses, if any, shall be transmitted to the Registrar of the Special Court at Nicosia.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

Short title. 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1955.

Amendment of Regulation 75 of the principal Regulations. 2. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 75 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the proviso thereto and by the substitution thereof of the following proviso :—

55 of 1955. " Provided that where any offence against these Regulations is a specified offence for the purposes of the Special Court Law, 1955, or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, such offence may be tried by a Special Court under and in accordance with the provisions of that Law instead of by the President of a District Court or a District Judge."
