## THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

JOHN HARDING,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Committals to the Special Court) Regulations, 1955.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any Law contained-

- (a) where any accused person has been committed, before or after the coming into operation of these Regulations, by a member of a District Court for trial by an Assize Court of an offence which is a specified offence for the purposes of the Special Court Laws, 1955, 55 of 1955 or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, such person 63 of 1955. may be tried by a Judge of the Special Court on information filed by or on behalf of the Attorney-General in the Special Court;
- (b) where any member of a District Court holds a preliminary inquiry under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Law or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, and the offence in respect of 39 of 1954 which such preliminary inquiry is held is a specified offence for 55 of 1954 the purposes of the Special Court Laws 2007 of 27 of 1955. the purposes of the Special Court Laws, 1955, or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, such member of the District Court holding such preliminary inquiry shall have power, and shall always be deemed to have had power, to commit the accused person in any such case for trial by a Judge of the Special Court, and in any such case the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Law, or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to any such committal as they apply to committals for trial before the Assize Court.
