## THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 13) 1956.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 26 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 13) 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Wireless Telegraphy on Ships and Vessels) Order, 1956.
- 2. The use of wireless telegraphy, including radar, on board any ships or vessel within any port in the Colony, not being a ship of war, is hereby prohibited.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 14) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 13) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 14) 1956.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 22, of the following new Regulation:—

"Powers of Chief Press and Radio Censor shall have the general direction and control of censorship of all newspapers and broadcasting services in the Colony and shall have all the powers of an Assistant Press Censor and an Assistant Radio Censor."
