THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW.

CAP. 266 AND LAW 1 OF 1953.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations:— Cap. 266.
1 of 1953.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prison (Temporary Provisions) Regulations, 1956.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Prison Regulations, the Governor may, if he considers it expedient so to do in the interests of maintaining discipline and order in a prison or in the public interest generally, direct the removal of a prisoner from a prison to a police prison for the purpose of serving the remainder of his sentence, or such part thereof as the Governor may direct, in such police prison. 3. These Regulations shall remain in force for a period of one year from the date hereof and shall then expire.

AUTHORIZATION UNDER SECTION 7 (1).
