**THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1956.**

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

JOHN HARDING,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Amendment of the Criminal Code) Regulations, 1956.

2. During the continuance in force of these Regulations, the Criminal Code shall be read and construed as if for section 112 thereof there were substituted the following section :—

“Mis-
leading or
obstruc-
ting public
officers.

112.—(1) Any person who—

(a) knowingly makes to any person employed in the public service and acting in an official capacity any false statement, oral or in writing ; or

(b) obstructs, knowingly misleads or otherwise interferes with, or impedes or withholds any information in his possession which he may reasonably be required to furnish from, any person employed in the public service, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

(2) No prosecution shall be instituted under this section without the previous consent of the Attorney-General or of the Solicitor-General.”.
