THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1955), His Excellency the Governor hereby cancels that part of the Order made by him under Defence Regulation 64 and published under Notification No. 635 to Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 18th October, 1955 (hereinafter called "the Order"), which affects the property set out in the Schedule hereto, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder, and the Second Schedule of the Order is hereby amended accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

The groundfloor and basement buildings and so much of the yard as is not used in connection with the first floor residence, of the privately-owned property under plot No. 1 of Block No. XII, Ayia Trias Quarter, Limassol Town.

THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.

CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952 AND 43 OF 1955.

NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to widen, improve and realign the public road between Famagusta and Larnaca by stages as may from time to time be decided (hereinafter referred to as "the road").

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor does hereby declare the widening, improving and realigning of the road to be an undertaking of public utility, and does hereby authorise the carrying out of the said undertaking, under the provisions of the said Law, and does hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Director of Public Works.
