SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (COLLECTIVE PUNISHMENT) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No.,1) 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 3.

Whereas in the evening of the 18th November, 1956, a gang of terrorists raided the Police Station of Pano Panayia village, which offence, in my opinion is an offence the commission of which is prejudicial to the internal security of the Colony and to the maintenance of public order in the Colony;

And whereas I have reason to believe that a number of the inhabitants of Panayia village took active part in burning down and destroying the Police Station of their village;

And whereas I have held an enquiry into the facts and circumstances appertaining to the offence after giving adequate opportunity to the inhabitants of the area of understanding the subject-matter of the enquiry and making representations thereon;

And whereas I have submitted a written report of the enquiry to His Excellency the Governor and have certified that the requirements of Regulation 5 have been complied with:

Now, therefore, I, the Commissioner of Paphos, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 3 of the Emergency Powers (Collective Punishment) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1955, and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, do hereby order that a fine of £950 (nine hundred fifty pounds) be levied collectively on the assessable inhabitants of Panayia.
