THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, No. 17. 1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Short title, Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 1) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 3) 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1956.

2. Paragraph (2) of Regulation 3 of the principal Regulations is hereby Amendment amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso (the full stop at the end thereof being substituted by a colon):—

- "Provided that if a police officer in charge of a Police Division is satisfied that the necessary inquiries into the circumstances of the arrest of any such person cannot be completed within the period of forty-eight hours, he may authorize the further detention of such person for an additional period, not exceeding fourteen days, but shall, on giving any such authorization, forthwith report the circumstances to the Commissioner of Police.".
- 3. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 24 of the principal Regulations is hereby Amendment amended by the deletion therefrom of sub-paragraph (b) and the substitution of Regulatherefor of the following sub-paragraph:

(b) to suppress the circulation of any newspaper or of any issue thereof.".

4. Regulation 28 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as Amendment follows :-

(a) by the deletion from the marginal note thereto of the words " wireless tion 28 of the telegraphy stations" and the substitution therefor of the words regulations. "wireless telegraphy stations and wireless telegraphy apparatus";

(b) by the insertion in paragraph (1) thereof, immediately after the words "wireless telegraphy station" (line 4), of the words "or any wireless telegraphy apparatus".

Amendment of Regulation 55 of the principal Regulations. 5. Regulation 55 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by the deletion therefrom of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following sub-paragraphs:—

"(b) wear any article of clothing or other article likely to be mistaken for any such uniform as is mentioned in subparagraph (a), unless he satisfies the Court that he had no intention that it should be so mistaken; or

(c) have in his possession, or sell or otherwise dispose of, any such uniform as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) to any person who is not authorized to wear such uniform,";

(b) by the insertion therein, immediately after paragraph (1) thereof, of the following paragraph:—

"(IA) No person shall import any such uniform as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) without a written licence so to do from the Commissioner of Police:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph contained shall apply to Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces or to the Government.".

Amendment of Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations. 6. The definition of "illegal strike", contained in paragraph (3) of Regulation 61 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words ", and which is calculated to, or may entail hardship to the community" (lines 2 and 3).
