No. 27. THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Regulations”), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 2) 1956.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 37, of the following new Regulation:—

“Control of
burials.

37A. Notwithstanding anything in these Regulations or in any Law to the contrary contained, the Governor may, if he is satisfied that it would be in the interest of internal security or of the maintenance of public order so to do—

(a) direct that the body of any person, who has been killed, or has died of wounds received, as a result of operations by Her Majesty's Forces or by the Police Force for the purpose of suppressing disturbances or of maintaining public order, shall be buried, according to the religious rites of the community to which such person belonged, in such manner, at such time and at such place as the Governor may direct;

(b) impose such restrictions as he may deem fit as to the time of the burial of the body of any person, not being a person referred to in paragraph (a) hereof, and as to the number of persons attending the ceremony connected with such burial.”
