THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations:-

I. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Short title. Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 5) Regulations, 1956, and shall be Gazettes: read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 4) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations,") tions"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 5) 1956.

2. Regulation 39 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended Amendment by the insertion therein, immediately after paragraph (5) thereof, of the of Regulation following new paragraphs:-

"(6) For the purposes of this Regulation the expression 'premises'

shall include a dwelling-house:

Provided that in the case of a dwelling-house no order shall be made under this Regulation-

(a) except with the approval of the Governor;

(b) unless an enquiry into the facts and circumstances giving rise to such order has been held by the Commissioner of the District.

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(7) In holding enquiries under paragraph (6) of this Regulation the Commissioner of the District shall satisfy himself that the persons living in the dwelling-houses concerned are given adequate opportunity of understanding the subject-matter of the enquiry and of making representations thereon, and, subject thereto, such enquiry shall be conducted in such manner as the Commissioner of the District thinks fit.

A written report of any enquiry shall be submitted to the Governor as soon as possible after the completion thereof, and shall contain a certificate that the requirements of this Regulation have been complied with.".

Insertion of new Regulation 62A in the principal Regulations. 3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 62, of the following new Regulation:—
"Prohibition of underwater swimming."

62A. The Commissioner of the District may, by order, prohibit, within such area as may be specified in the order, underwater swimming with the aid of any artificial breathing apparatus."

THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955.

LAWS 17 AND 47 OF 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 618 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 13th October, 1955, I do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Limassol District No. 8) Order, 1956.
- 2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Limassol or the Superintendent of Police in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 31st March, 1956.

From 8.15 p.m. on Saturday the 31st March, 1956, and 6.00 a.m. on Sunday the 1st April, 1956.
