Whereas by Order dated the 19th October, 1955, published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 20th October, 1955, under Notification No. 638 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), the Governor had authorized the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Pano Platres (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months:

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months as from

the expiration of the Order:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1955), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorization for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 19th April, 1956, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955. LAWS 17 AND 47 OF 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 618 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 13th October, 1955, I do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Nicosia District No. 10)

Order, 1956.

2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Nicosia or the Assistant Commissioner of Police in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 6th day of April 1956.

FIRST SCHEDULE. Within the boundaries of Tymbou village.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

From 0500 hours, 6th April, 1956 to 0500 hours, 7th April, 1956.
