2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Famagusta or the Superintendent of Police in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 20th day of April, 1956.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Within the village boundaries of Kornokipos, Ayios Khariton, Trypimeni, Artemi, Ayios Nikolaos, Malounda and Platani, and the Municipal boundaries of Akanthou.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

From 19.00 hours on 20th April, 1956, until 04.30 hours on 21st April, 1956, and thereafter nightly between the same hours until further notice.

THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955. LAWS 17 AND 47 OF 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 618 published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 13th October, 1955, I do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Kyrenia District No. K. 13) Order, 1956.
- 2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Kyrenia or the Assistant Commissioner of Police in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 20th day of April, 1956, until further notice.
