THE ADULTERATION OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE LAW, 1954.

26.9.57. **p.825.** 59 of 1954

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 13.

In exercise of the powers vested in him under section 13 of the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce Regulations, 1955, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Alulteration of Agricultural Produce Regulations, 1955 and 1956.
