**THE ADULTERATION OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE
LAW, 1954.**

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 13.

In exercise of the powers vested in him under section 13 of the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce Law, 1954, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce Regulations, 1955, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Adulteration of Agricultural Produce Regulations, 1955 and 1956.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by :—

- (1) The deletion from regulation 3 of the principal Regulations of the phrase "for export, or preparation for export from the Colony".
(2) The deletion of the word "export" appearing in regulations 4 and 5 of the principal Regulations.

3. The First Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended by :—

- (1) The deletion of the words "export and" appearing in the third column of the Schedule thereto.

- (2) The insertion immediately below the words "Broadbeans" in the first column of the Schedule of the words "Broom corn beard" and exactly opposite "Broom corn beard" of the figure "one" in the Second and Third column thereto.
- (3)—(i) The deletion immediately after the word "carobs" of the words "in whatever form" and the substitution therefor of the words "other than carob seed";
- (ii) the insertion immediately below the word "carobs" of the following :—

- (4) The addition at the end of the First Schedule of the following proviso :—
 "Provided that a maximum of twenty per cent broken rice and five per cent broken shelled nuts shall not be deemed to be "superfluous or inferior substance".

For every five packets or part thereof imported and submitted for examination or re-examination ..	5
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(b) *Imported in bulk :*

For every ten okes or part thereof imported and submitted for examination or re-examination	20
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Provided that the minimum examination or re-examination fees shall be 20 mils and that the total examination or re-examination fees shall be payable to the nearest multiple of 5 mils.

If in the opinion of the Inspector a chemical analysis is required to ascertain whether a produce is adulterated, the prescribed fees for the time being in force for such chemical analysis for each sample submitted by the Inspector shall be payable to the Collector of Customs at the port of entry by the Importer or his agent".

5. These Regulations shall come into effect on the 1st day of February, 1956.
