# CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952 AND 43 OF 1955.

## NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

## JOHN HARDING,

Governor.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to carry out a water supply scheme known as "The Greater Nicosia Water Supply Scheme" for the purpose of supplying water to the suburbs of Nicosia town, namely, Strovolos, Engomi, Ayios Dhometios, Orta Keuy, Trakhonas, Omorphita, Kaimakli and Eylenja, and of providing in bulk an additional quantity of water to the present Area of Supply of the Water Board of Nicosia:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, I, the Governor, do hereby declare the carrying out of the Greater Nicosia Water Supply Scheme to be an undertaking of public utility, and do hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Director of Water Development.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2836.

#### APPROVAL OF SCHEME UNDER SECTION 4.
