## THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAWS, 1954 AND 1955.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2818

MADE UNDER SECTION 133.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 133 of the Customs 8 of 1954 Management Laws, 1954 and 1955, His Excellency the Governor, with the 49 of 1955 advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Local Authorities) (Duty Exemption and Reduction) Order, 1956.
- 2. This Order shall apply to all vehicles, machinery (including office machinery), appliances, equipment and similar articles of a non-consumable nature, imported by the Council of any Municipal Corporation or by the Board of any Improvement Area, which the Mayor of such Corporation or the Chairman of such Board, as the case may be, certifies, and the Comptroller is satisfied, are to be used solely for the public purposes of such Corporation or Board (hereinafter referred to as "the specified articles").
  - 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Customs Law :-
  - (a) where any specified article has origin in a Commonwealth country, such specified article shall be admitted into the Colony free of any Customs duty;
  - (b) where any specified article has origin in a country other than a Commonwealth country, the duty payable on such specified article shall be reduced by an amount equivalent to the amount of duty which would, but for the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, have been payable if such article had origin in a Commonwealth country.

THE EXCHANGE CONTROL LAWS, 1952 AND 1954.

Delegation by the Financial Secretary under Section 39 (4).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 39 (4) of the Exchange Control Laws, 1952 and 1954, I, the Financial Secretary, do hereby delegate to the Director of Commerce and Industry to the Government the following powers of granting or withholding permission, consent or authority to the performance by any person of any act for which the permission, consent or authority of the Financial Secretary is required under the said Laws.
