THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

Bye-laws made by the Improvement Board of Kili.

Gazette: Supplement No 3: 18.2.1953. In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Kili hereby make the following bye-laws:—

- 1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kili (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kili Bye-laws, 1953 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kili Bye-laws, 1953 and 1956.
- 2. Bye-law 26 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures 2/-, 3/-, 1/-, $-/4\frac{1}{2}$, $-/4\frac{1}{2}$, 1/- and 1/-, appearing opposite items (a) to (g), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor of the figures and words 100 mils, 150 mils, 50 mils, 25 mils, 25 mils, 50 mils and 100 mils, respectively.
- 3. Bye-law 37 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—
 - "37.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say:—

 Mils.
 - (a) When the value of such goods is under 100 mils (b) When the value of such goods exceeds 100 mils but does not exceed 200 mils 23 (c) When the value of such goods exceeds 200 mils but does not exceed 400 mils 33 (d) When the value of such goods exceeds 400 mils but does not exceed 750 mils 45 (e) When the value of such goods exceeds 750 mils but does not exceed £1.000... (f) When the value of such goods exceeds £1.000 but does not exceed £2.000 75 (g) When the value of such goods exceeds £2.000 but does not exceed £4.000...
 - (2) If the value of such goods exceeds £4.000, a fee of 23 mils for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 150 mils."
- 4. Bye-law 51 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures -/3, -/3, -/6, 1/- and 1/3 appearing opposite items (a) to (e), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor of the figures and words 18 mils, 18 mils, 33 mils, 50 mils and 68 mils respectively.
- 5. Bye-law 58 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures 1/-, 1/- and 1/3 appearing opposite items (a), (b) and (c) and the substitution therefor of the figures and words 50 mils, 50 mils and 68 mils, respectively.
- 6. Bye-law 65 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "two piastres" (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "10 mils".
- 7. Bye-law 75 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures 2/-, $-/4\frac{1}{2}$, -/3, -/1, -/1 and -/2 appearing opposite items (a) to (f), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor of the figures and words 100 mils, 25 mils, 18 mils, 5 mils, 5 mils and 10 mils, respectively.

8. Bye-law 81 (1) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the model bye-laws published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 14th March, 1951) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "two to forty shillings" (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the figures and words " 100 mils to £2.000"

9. Bye-law 91 (2) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the model bye-laws published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 14th March, 1951) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "two piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word

' 10 mils '

10. Bye-law 110 (4) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figure "10s." (line 2) and the substitution therefor

of the figure and word "500 mils".

11. Bye-law 117 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion from sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof of the figures £2 and £3(line 2 in both cases) and from the proviso thereof of the figure £1 (line 4) and the substitution therefor of the figures and words £2.000 mils, £5.000 mils and £1.000 mils, respectively.

12. Bye-law 135 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figure and word "20 shillings" (line 2) and the

substitution therefor of the figure and word "£1.000 mils.".

13. Bye-law 136 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figure and word "10 shillings" (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "500 mils".

14. Bye-law 139 (3) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figure and word "3 shillings" (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "150 mils".

15. Bye-law 155 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures -/2, -/3, $-/4\frac{1}{2}$ and 1/- appearing opposite sub-paragraphs (a) to (d), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor of the figures and words 10 mils, 18 mils, 25 mils and 50 mils respectively.

16. Bye-law 160 (1) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the model bye-laws published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 14th March, 1951) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

Bye-law 163 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion from sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) thereof of the figure and words "25 shillings", "ten shillings" and "five shillings" (line 2 in all cases) and the substitution therefor of the figures and words "£1.250 mils", "500 mils" and "250 mils", respectively.
- 18. Bye-law 171 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "six piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "33 mils".
- 19. Bye-law 178 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended as follows :-
 - (1) By the deletion therefrom of the words "two paras per oke in respect thereof" (line 4) and the substitution therefor of the figures and words "5 mils for every 20 okes or part thereof".

(2) By the deletion of the provisos thereto.

20. Bye-law 179 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "four and a half piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "25 mils".

21. Bye-law 181 (2) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the model bye-laws published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 14th March,

1951) is hereby amended as follows:-

(i) By the deletion from sub-paragraph (a) of the words "one shilling" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "50 mils";

(ii) By the deletion from sub-paragraph (b) of the words "seven piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word

"40 mils";

- (iii) By the deletion from sub-paragraph (c) of the words "five piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "28 mils";
- (iv) By the deletion from sub-paragraph (d) of the words "three piastres" (line 4) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "18 mils";
- (v) By the deletion from sub-paragraph (e) of the words "three piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "18 mils";
- (vi) By the deletion from sub-paragraph (f) of the words "three piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "18 mils".
- 22. Bye-law 185 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "An annual fee not exceeding: shillings" (line 4) and of the figures "10/-, 10/-, 20/-, 10/-, 40/- and 300/-" opposite sub-paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) respectively and the substitution therefor of the words "An annual fee not exceeding: Mils." and of the figures and words "500 mils, 500 mils, £1.000, 500 mils, £2.000 and £15.000" respectively.

23. The Second Schedule to the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor:—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates:

Provided that-

(a) Fractions under 2 mils shall not be collected;

- (b) For fractions of over 3 mils up to 5, a fee of 5 mils shall be collected;
- (c) For fractions of over 5 mils to 9 mils inclusive, a fee of 10 mils shall be collected:

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, or measuring or testing shall be 5 mils."

The above by laws have been approved by the Administrative Secretary. (M.P. 1595/52.)

No. 548. THE IRRIGATION (PRIVATE WATER) ASSOCIATION LAWS, 1949 AND 1954.

In pursuance of the provisions of sub-section (3) of section 12 of the Irrigation (Private Water) Association Laws, 1949 and 1954, the following rules made by the Committee of the Irrigation Association of Anayia ("Kourtelli Water"), in the District of Nicosia, are published in the Gazette.

IRRIGATION ASSOCIATION OF ANAYIA (" KOURTELLI WATER").

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Irrigation Association of Anayia ("Kourtelli Water") Rules, 1956.
 - 2. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the District of Nicosia;
 - "Committee" means the Committee of the Irrigation Association;
 "Irrigation Association" means the Irrigation Association of Anayia ("Kourtelli
 - Water");
 "Law" means the Irrigation (Private Water) Association Laws, 1949 and 1954;
 "List" means the list of the names and residences of the proprietors and of the extent
 "List" means the list of the water as finally settled in accordance with the of the interest of each proprietor in the water, as finally settled in accordance with the provisions of section 11 of the Law;
 "Works" means the irrigation works of the Irrigation Association.
- 3. The present Committee shall hold office for a period of three years beginning on the 24th October, 1954. The election of each subsequent Committee shall take place in the manner hereinafter provided every three years in the third week of the month of October and it shall hold office for a period of three years from the date of the expiration of the period of office of the previous Committee.
- 4.—(1) The Commissioner shall, not less than one month before the holding of the meeting as in rule 3 provided, cause a written notice thereof to be—
- (a) published in a newspaper or newspapers; and (b) posted in a conspicuous place in the town, village or quarter in which the water is situate. (2) All expenses connected with the notices shall be paid for from the funds of the Irrigation Association.
- 5.—(1) The Commissioner shall preside at every meeting so convened and if any question the commissioner shall preside at every meeting so convened and it any question is raised as to the right of a person to attend thereat or to vote, the Commissioner may there and then make such enquiry as he may deem requisite and declare whether such person has a right to attend or to vote or not and the decision so made shall be final; and an entry shall be made in the minutes of the meeting of any such question and of the decision thereon.

(2) No business shall be transacted at any such meeting and no decision shall be taken thereat, unless more than one-half of the aggregate number of the proprietors are present in person or are represented by a proxy properly appointed by an instrument signed in the presence of and certified

by a mukhtar.
