THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 3) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 2) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 3) 1956.

2. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 2 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein, in its proper alphabetical place, of the following definition :—

"member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces' includes persons who are War Department Auxiliary Policemen and Royal Air Force Auxiliary Policemen, when acting in the course of their duties as such ;".

3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 24, of the following new Regulation :—

"Power to seize printing press and premises used for printing."
24A.—(1) The Governor may direct any police officer or other person to seize and take possession of—

(a) any printing press which the Governor has reasonable cause to believe has been used for the printing of any newspaper or document the printing or publishing of which contravenes any of the provisions of these Regulations or of any Law in force for the time being, or in respect of which any person has been convicted of an offence under any Law relating to sedition or seditious publications ;

- (b) any type, machinery, apparatus or equipment used or adapted or intended for use for any purpose connected with the operation of any such printing press ; and
- (c) any premises in which such printing press, type, machinery, apparatus or equipment may be found or in which the Governor has reasonable cause to believe that any such newspaper or document as aforesaid has been printed or published.

(2) Any article or premises seized under this Regulation shall be disposed of as the Governor may order.”.

Revocation of Regulation 32 of the principal Regulations.

4. Regulation 32 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked.

Amendment of Regulation 33 of the principal Regulations

5. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 33 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately before the word “ give ” (line 4), of the word “ may ”.

Amendment of Regulation 58 of the principal Regulations.

6. Regulation 58 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows :—

- (a) by the substitution for the brackets and words “ (civil or military) ”, occurring in line 2 of sub-paragraph (a) thereof, of the brackets and words “ (civil, naval, military or air force) ” ;
- (b) by the substitution for the words “ this sub-regulation ”, occurring in line 2 of sub-paragraph (c) thereof, of the words “ this Regulation ”.
