No. 70. THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,  
1939 AND 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1952, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Extended Jurisdiction of Justices of the Special Court) Regulations, 1956.

2.—(1) In these Regulations the expression “specified offence” has the meaning assigned to that expression by section 2 of the Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1956, or by any Law amending or substituted for the same.

(2) The Interpretation Law shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations and of any order made or direction given thereunder, as it applies to the interpretation of a Law and, for the purposes of the said Law, these Regulations shall be deemed to be Laws.

3.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1956, or in any other Law contained, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Chief Justice, by order, invest any Justice of the Special Court with power to try such specified offences as the Chief Justice may, from time to time, direct and which, but for the provisions of these Regulations, would only be triable by a Judge of the Special Court.

(2) Any such Justice of the Special Court shall, by virtue of such order, have, in respect of the specified offences tried by him in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, all the powers and jurisdiction of a Judge of the Special Court.
