THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF PEDHOULAS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Pedhoulas hereby make the following bye-laws :--

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Bye-laws, 1951 to 1953 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Bye-laws, 1951 to 1956.

2. Bye-law 26 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :---

" 26. The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the appropriate slaughter-house, that is to say :-

22. Bye-law 191 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :---

"191. The Board shall fix from time to time the rates to be paid for the supply of electric light by the Board to any premises within the improvement area not exceeding the following rates :---

(a) In respect of a house, hotel, boarding house, lodging house, shop, khan and any other premises not possessing meters and having at least 4 lamps, each lamp not exceeding 25 candle-power, one hundred and fifty mils per month for each lamp.

For every additional lamp, not exceeding 25 candle-power, over 4 lamps, one hundred mils per month.

For a single lamp not exceeding 25 candle-power, two hundred mils per month.

Lamps exceeding 25 candle-power but not exceeding 50 candlepower shall be considered as two lamps: a lamp exceeding 50 candle-power but not exceeding 75 candle-power shall be considered as 3 lamps and so on for every additional 25 candlepower or any part thereof.

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 5 mils".
