**THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1956.**

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 9) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 8) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 9) 1956.

2. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 3 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion at the end thereof, immediately after the words "these Regulations" (line 6), of the words "and such police officer or member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces may take such steps and use such force as may appear to him to be reasonably necessary for effecting such arrest".

3. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after sub-paragraph (c) thereof, of the following sub-paragraph (the full-stop at the end of the said paragraph (c) being substituted by a semi-colon) :—

"(d) take such steps and use such force as may appear to him to be reasonably necessary for securing compliance with the provisions of this Regulation".

4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 35, of the following new Regulation :—

"Signs
and slogans
on roads.

35A.—(1) Where any illegal sign or slogan is written or otherwise placed on, or in the vicinity of, any road, any police officer or any member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces may give directions requiring any of the inhabitants of any town, village area or quarter, to remove such sign or slogan and any person who contravenes any such directions shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to the penalties provided for in Regulation 75 of these Regulations.

(2) Without prejudice to the taking of any action under paragraph (1) of this Regulation, the Commissioner of the District may, by order, prohibit the use of any road, or the use of any vehicle on any road, on which, or in the vicinity of which, there is an illegal sign or slogan.”.

Revocation of Regulation 64 of the principal Regulations and substitution of new Regulation.

5. Regulation 64 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following Regulation substituted therefor :—

“ Bells.
Cap. 47.

64. Without prejudice to any other powers conferred by the Bells (Regulation) Law (hereinafter referred to as ‘ the said Law ’) or any other Law, where the Commissioner of the District is satisfied that any bell (as defined in section 2 of the said Law) has been sounded or rung in contravention of the provisions of the said Law, the Commissioner of the District may, without prejudice to any proceedings which may be instituted in respect of such contravention under the provisions of the said Law, direct the taking of such steps in respect of such bell (including the closing of the belfry and the removal of the bell or any part thereof) as the Commissioner of the District may deem fit.”.

Insertion of new Regulation 71A in the principal Regulations.

6. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 71, of the following new Regulation :—

“ Powers of
the Court.

71A.—(1) A Court may at any time order that no person shall publish the name, address or photograph of any witness in any case tried or about to be tried before it for any offence, or any evidence or any other thing likely to lead to the identification of any such witness.

(2) Any person who acts in contravention of any such order shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.”.

Amendment of Regulation 75 of the principal Regulations.

7. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 75 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of sub-paragraph (a) and the substitution therefor of the following sub-paragraph :—

“ (a) contravenes or fails to comply with any of these Regulations or any Order or rule made under any of these Regulations or any direction given or requirement imposed under any of these Regulations or under any Order or rule made under any of these Regulations or who does any act which is declared to be an offence under any of these Regulations ; or ”.

Insertion of new Regulation 75A in the principal Regulations.

8. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 75, of the following new Regulation :—

“ Seizure
and forfeiture
of
vessels and
vehicles.

75A. Any police officer or any member of Her Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces may seize any vessel or vehicle suspected of being or of having been used for or in connection with the commission of an offence against these Regulations, or of any offence which is a specified offence for the purposes of the Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1956, or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, and the Special Court may, if satisfied that the vessel or vehicle was so used, either on application made by the police in that behalf or in the course of any proceedings against any person for the offence in connection with which such vessel or vehicle was used, order such vessel or vehicle to be forfeited.”
