

23. Any police officer may seize any vessel or vehicle suspected of being, or of having been, used for or in connection with the commission of an offence against these Regulations and a Judge or Justice of the Special Court may, if satisfied that the vessel or vehicle was so used, either on application made by the police in that behalf or in the course of any proceedings against any person for the offence in connection with which such vessel or vehicle was used, order such vessel or vehicle to be forfeited.

24. Nothing in these Regulations shall be deemed to relieve any person of any obligation under any other law to be in possession of a passport or any other travel document whatsoever.

25. The powers conferred upon police officers by Regulations 10, 18 and 23 of these Regulations may be exercised by any member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces.

26. None of the following persons shall be required to register under these Regulations :—

Exemptions

- (a) the Governor ;
- (b) any member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces or of the Cyprus Police Force in possession of the official identity card or other document of identity normally issued to the members of such Forces ;
- (c) children under the age of 12 years ;
- (d) any person in transit provided that he is in actual possession of a passport or other travel document that has been stamped by an Immigration Officer for the purpose of his visit, or of an official document permit issued by an immigration officer ;
- (e) any person to whom a Consular identity card has been issued by the Government.

27. The Emergency Powers (Registration Areas) Regulations, 1956, are hereby revoked :

Provided that any orders made or identity cards issued under the said Regulations which are in force immediately before the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations shall, until revoked or cancelled, be deemed to be orders made or identity cards issued under these Regulations and shall, with necessary modifications, have effect accordingly.

**No. 716. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW.**  
**CAP. 142.**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2853**

**MADE UNDER SECTION 10.**

*Authority to the Village Health Commission of Geunyeli  
(Nicosia District) to contract a loan.*

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 10 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. The Village Health Commission of Geunyeli (Nicosia District) (hereinafter referred to as "the Village Health Commission") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lender") the sum of three thousand pounds (£3,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say :—

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Village Health Commission to the Lender in ten equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);

- (b) the Village Health Commission shall, in each year and until final repayment of the sum borrowed, insert in the annual estimates as a charge on its revenues the annual instalment payable in the year to which such estimates relate ;
- (c) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Village Health Commission for the asphaltting of the village streets.
2. For the purposes of securing the repayment of the sum due under the loan the Village Health Commission is hereby authorized, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, to mortgage to the Lender all the fees, charges and rates now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Village Health Commission under the provisions of the Public Health (Villages) Law.

THE HOUSING LAW, 1955.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2854

APPROVAL OF SCHEME UNDER SECTION 4.
