THE POLICE LAW.

CAP. 265 AND LAWS 24 OF 1953, 31 OF 1954, 21 OF 1955, 39 OF 1955 AND 48 OF 1955.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 58.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 58 of the Police Law, I, the Commissioner of Police, with the approval of the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :--

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police (United Kingdom Unit) (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Police (United Kingdom Unit) Regulations, 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations".)

2. Regulation 10 of the principal Regulations is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor :—

" 10. A member of the Unit may, within seven days from the date of the communication to him of the decision of the Commissioner to impose any punishment, appeal to the Governor, whose decision shall be final :

Provided that if the member of the Unit is dismissed, or required to resign, or reduced to a lower rate of pay then---

- (i) if the member of the Unit does not appeal the punishment shall be subject to confirmation by the Governor with the approval of the Secretary of State ; and
- (ii) if the member of the Unit appeals, the Governor shall, before deciding the appeal, refer the matter to the Secretary of State, to whom he shall forward any written representations that the member of the Unit may wish to make.".
