THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS 1955 TO (No. 10) 1956.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 60 (4).

Whereas there is reason to believe that an island-wide strike may be declared by the Pancyprian Federation of Labour, the Pancyprian Federation of Independent Trade Unions and the Cyprus Turkish Trade Unions Federation in sympathy with a trade dispute at Mitsero and Kalavassos Mines for Thursday the 23rd August, 1956;

And whereas it is necessary to secure that enough workers are available in undertakings engaged in the essential works set out in the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Regulation 60 (4) of the Emergency Powers (Public Safery and Order) Regulations 1955 to (No. 10) 1956, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the persons employed in the undertakings set out in the Schedule hereto shall not absent themselves from work on the 23rd August, 1956, and any other day to which the aforesaid island-wide strike may hereafter be postponed.

2. This order is in addition to and not in derogation of the Essential Works Order, 1943.

SCHEDULE.

1. All works and services in connection with the transport of Naval, Military and Air Force personnel or stores (including the supply of aviation fuels), building and constructional material and any civilian transport, whether hired directly by the aforesaid authorities or through contractors or sub-contractors.

2. All works and services in connection with the building construction or repair of Naval, Military and Air Force structures (including Aerodromes).

3. All works on, or in connection with, any Aerodrome.

 All works in connection with the loading or unloading of ships containing military stores.
