In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Bombardment Range Areas Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make and hereby makes the following regulations :—

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Bombardment Range Areas (Amendment) Regulations, 1956 and shall be read as one with the Bombardment Range Areas Regulations, 1949 to (No. 2) 1953 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Bombardment Range Areas Regulations, 1949 to 1956.

(2) The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after regulation 27 (as set out in the Bombardment Range Areas (Amendment) Regulations (No. 2), 1953), of the following headings and regulations :—

“ THE CAPE PYLA BOMBARDMENT RANGE AREA.

28. In this part of these Regulations the ‘ Cape Pyla Bombardment Range Area ’ means the area declared as such under section 2 of the Law by notice to be published in the *Gazette* or by any other notice amending or substituted for the same.

29. The danger signals to be hoisted or displayed in respect of the Cape Pyla Bombardment Range Area shall be as follows :—

(a) By day :

- (i) A red flag on Cape Greco ;
- (ii) A red flag on Cape Pyla ;
- (iii) A red flag at Dhekelia ;
- (iv) A red flag displayed from a boat patrolling outside the limits of the sea Danger Area.

(b) By night :

A red light displayed at each of the four points mentioned in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) of paragraph (a) above.

THE LARNACA BOMBARDMENT RANGE AREA.

30. In this part of the regulations the ‘ Larnaca Bombardment Range Area ’ means the area declared as such under section 2 of the Law by notice to be published in the *Gazette*, or by any other notice amending or substituted for the same.

31. The signals to be hoisted or displayed in respect of the Larnaca Bombardment Range Area shall be as follows :—

(a) By day :

- (i) A red flag hoisted on the beach at a point marking the northern limit of the Danger Area ;
- (ii) A red flag hoisted on the beach at a point marking the southern limit of the Danger Area ;
- (iii) A red flag hoisted on the Marker’s Shelter situated at the eastern landward limit of the Danger Area.

(b) By night :

A red light displayed on each of the stations mentioned in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (a) above.”
