THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1956.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

JOHN HARDING, Governor.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Short title. Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 11) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations 1955 to (No. 10) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to 14.12.1955 (No. 11) 1956.

2. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after sub-paragraph (d)thereof, of the following sub-paragraph (the full-stop at the end of the said sub-paragraph (d) being substituted by a semi-colon):—

"(e) for controlling or restricting his communication with other persons.".

Amendment of Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations.

Insertion of new Regulation 47A in the principal Regulations.

Insertion of 3. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion new Regulation, immediately after Regulation 47, of the following new Regulation:—

"Register to be kept of residents and guests in monasteries. Cap. 104. 33 of 1952.

47A.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the Hotels Law or in any other Law contained, every person in charge of a monastery shall keep or cause to be kept a register wherein he shall cause every person resident in the monastery and every guest who stays in the monastery to write his name together with the following particulars:—

(a) place of ordinary residence;

(b) nationality;

(c) profession or business;

(d) date of arrival;

(e) place from which arrived;

(f) date of departure;

(g) place to which departing;(h) number and description of identity card (if any):

Provided that if any resident or guest is illiterate the person in charge of the monastery shall write the name and particulars himself or shall cause them to be written by some literate person.

(2) Every person in charge of a monastery shall-

(a) present the register kept as in paragraph (1) of this Regulation provided to every person resident in the monastery on the date of the coming into force of this Regulation and to every person who thereafter proposes to stay in the monastery whether as a permanent resident or as a guest and shall request such person to write his name in such register, together with the particulars specified in paragraph (1) of this Regulation;

(b) present such register for inspection whenever so requested by any police officer or member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air

Forces.

(3) (a) Any person in charge of a monastery who-

(i) fails to keep a register as in paragraph (1) of this Regulation provided; or

(ii) fails, neglects or refuses to comply with any of the requirements of paragraph (2) of this Regulation;

shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable on conviction to the penalties provided for in Regulation 75 of these Regulations.

(b) Any person who—

(i) refuses to write his name in any register kept as in paragraph (1) of this Regulation provided; or

(ii) makes in any such register any statement or entry knowing the same to be false; shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable on conviction to the penalties provided for in Regulation 75 of these Regulations.".
