- 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Kythrea) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Municipal Corporation (Kythrea) Bye-laws, 1932 to 1954 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these Bye-laws may together be cited as the Municipal Corporation (Kythrea) Bye-laws, 1932 to 1956.
- 2. Bye-law 16 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "one piastre" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the words "ten mils".
- 3. Bye-law 21G of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1939) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

- 5. Bye-law 61A of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—
  - "61A.—(1) A fee of not less than the minimum and not exceeding the maximum fixed under this bye-law shall be paid to the town clerk and

- (2) The fee shall be paid in respect of the period ending on the 31st December of each year, irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable."
- 6. Bye-law 68 (1) and 68 (2) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea Municipal Bye-laws, 1932) is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—
  - "68—(1) The following charge shall be paid by every person posting or exhibiting any notice or advertisement on any hoarding, that is to say:—

Size of Notice or Advertisement, not exceeding—

For each week or part thereof..  $2 \times 2$  feet  $3 \times 3$  feet 50 mils ... 100 mils

- (2) The charge in this bye-law prescribed shall be paid to the town clerk and treasurer."
- 7. Bye-law 69 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1939) is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "one shilling" (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the words "fifty mils".
- 8. Paragraph 1 (b) of bye-law 72B of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1950) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—
  - "(b) The entertainment duty shall be payable by the manager and shall be as follows:—

- 9. Bye-law 72M (1) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Kythrea Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948) is hereby amended:—
  - (a) by the deletion therefrom of the words "two paras" (line 5) and the substitution therefor of the words "three mils for every ten okes or part thereof."
  - (b) by the repeal of the provisos (a), (b) and (c) and the substitution therefor of the following provisos:—
    - "(i) the fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils.
      - (ii) when such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils the nearest multiple of five mils whether higher or lower shall be collected.
    - (iii) the minimum fee for any weighing, measuring or testing shall be five mils."
