THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT)
LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF PRODHROMOS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Prodhromos hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Prodhromos (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Prodhromos Bye-laws, 1951 and 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these Bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Prodhromos Bye-laws, 1951 to 1956.

2. Bye-law 26 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (h) both inclusive and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—

"300 mils, 450 mils, 135 mils, 85 mils, 100 mils, 150 mils, 250 mils, 400 mils";

(b) by the deletion of the words "five shillings" (line 2) of the proviso and the substitution therefor of the words "two hundred and fifty mils".

3. Bye-law 37 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

"37.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say :—

	<i>mils</i>
(a) When the value of such goods is under 100 mils ..	5
(b) When the value of such goods exceeds 100 mils but does not exceed 200 mils	10
(c) When the value of such goods exceeds 200 mils but does not exceed 400 mils	25
(d) When the value of such goods exceeds 400 mils but does not exceed 750 mils	35
(e) When the value of such goods exceeds 750 mils but does not exceed 1,000 mils	50
(f) When the value of such goods exceeds 1,000 mils but does not exceed 2,000 mils	75
(g) When the value of such goods exceeds 2,000 mils but does not exceed 4,000 mils	125

(2) If the value of such goods exceeds £4, a fee of 30 mils for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 125 mils".

4. Bye-law 51 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (e), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—
"50 mils, 35 mils, 100 mils, 150 mils, 200 mils".

5. Bye-law 58 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (c), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—
"100 mils, 150 mils, 250 mils".

6. Bye-law 65 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the figure "1p." (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the figure and word "5 mils".

7. Bye-law 75 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (h), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—

“ 100 mils, 75 mils, 150 mils, 15 mils, 10 mils, 3 mils, 5 mils, 10 mils ”.

8. Bye-law 81 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ two to forty shillings ” (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the words “ one hundred to two thousand mils ”.

9. Bye-law 82 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (c), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—

“ 500 mils, 75 mils, 25 mils ”;

(b) by the deletion of the figures “ 1p. to 20s. ” (line 2) of item (d) and the substitution therefor of the figures and words “ 5 mils to 1,000 mils ”.

10. Bye-law 91 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ two piastres ” (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the words “ ten mils ”.

11. Bye-law 117 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ three shillings ” (line 5) of the proviso thereto and the substitution therefor of the words “ one hundred and fifty mils ”.

12. Bye-law 135 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ twenty shillings ” (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the words “ one thousand mils ”.

13. Bye-law 136 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ twenty shillings ” (lines 1 and 2) and the substitution therefor of the words “ one thousand mils ”.

14. Bye-law 139 (3) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ ten shillings ” (line 1) and the substitution therefor of the words “ five hundred mils ”.

15. Bye-law 155 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (d), both inclusive, and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—

“ 20 mils, 25 mils, 100 mils, 200 mils ”.

16. Bye-law 160 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 160.—(1) The following charges shall be paid by every person posting or exhibiting any advertisement or notice on any hoarding, that is to say :—

*Size of advertisement or notice
not exceeding—*

	<i>2 × 2 feet</i>	<i>3 × 3 feet</i>
(a) For each day	5 mils	10 mils
(b) For each week or part thereof	20 mils	35 mils
(c) For each month or part thereof	50 mils	100 mils.

17. Bye-law 171 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the figures and words “ 6 piastres ” and “ 4 piastres ” (lines 3 and 4) respectively and the substitution thereof in their respective order of the figures and words “ 35 mils ” and “ 25 mils ”.

18. Bye-law 178 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 178.—(1) Whenever any authorized weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the authorized weigher upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of three mils per seven okes in respect thereof and such authorized weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Board may from

time to time prescribe and any person paying any such fee shall require the authorized weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that—

- (a) fractions under three mils shall not be collected ;
- (b) for fractions of three mils and over and under five mils the sum of five mils shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be five mils.

19. Bye-law 179 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "six piastres" (line 3) and the substitution therefor of the words "thirty five mils".

20. Bye-law 181 (2) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended as follows :—

- (1) By the deletion of the words "one shilling" (line 3 of subparagraph (a)) and the substitution therefor of the words "fifty mils".
- (2) By the deletion of the words "seven piastres" (line 3 of subparagraph (b)) and the substitution therefor of the words "forty mils".
- (3) By the deletion of the words "five piastres" (line 3 of subparagraph (c)) and the substitution therefor of the words "thirty mils".
- (4) By the deletion of the words "three piastres" (line 4 of subparagraph (d)) and the substitution therefor of the words "twenty mils".
- (5) By the deletion of the words "three piastres" (line 3 of subparagraph (e)) and the substitution therefor of the words "twenty mils".
- (6) By the deletion of the words "three piastres" (line 3 of subparagraph (f)) and the substitution therefor of the words "twenty mils".

21. Bye-law 185 (1) of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 561, *Gazette* Supplement No. 3 of 17.12.1952) is hereby amended by the deletion of the fees appearing opposite items (a) to (o) both inclusive and the substitution therefor in their respective order of the following fees :—

"£3, £5, £15, £10, £5, £10, £15, £5, £1, £1.500 mils, £3, £20, £10, £20, £20".

22. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the Second Schedule thereto and the substitution therefor of the following new Schedule :—

Provided that fractions under 3 mils shall not be collected.

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing or measuring or testing shall be 5 mils".

IRRIGATION DIVISION OF PHILIA.

Rules.

These rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Philia (Amendment) Rules, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Irrigation Division of Philia Rules, 1935, 1939 and 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules") and the principal Rules and these Rules may together be cited as the Irrigation Division of Philia Rules, 1935 to 1956.

2. Rule 4 (a) of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "April" and "May" and the substitution therefor of the words "August" and "September".

3. Rule 4 (b) of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "1st June" and the substitution therefor of the words "1st October".

4. Rule 6 of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "31st May" and the substitution therefor of the words "30th September".

In pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Law, the following rules made by the Committee of the Irrigation Division of Kato Zodhia, in the District of Nicosia, are published in the *Gazette*.

IRRIGATION DIVISION OF KATO ZODHIA.

Rules.

These rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Kato Zodhia (Amendment) Rules, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Irrigation Division of Kato Zodhia Rules, 1936 and 1945 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules") and the principal Rules and these Rules may together be cited as the Irrigation Division of Kato Zodhia Rules, 1936 to 1956.

2. Rule 4 (c) of the principal Rules is hereby repealed and the following rule substituted therefor :—

"4.—(c) The treasurer shall receive a remuneration of three per centum of all rates and charges collected by him as in paragraph 4 (a) hereof :
Provided that he shall be paid such of his out of pocket expenses as may be sanctioned by the Committee."
