THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Lyso to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, I, the Acting Administrative Secretary, do hereby order as follows:—

- r. The Improvement Board of Lyso (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding six hundred pounds (£600) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—
 - (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in ten equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
 - (b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the improvement of the village water supply.
- 2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.

CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952 AND 43 OF 1955.

Notice under Sections 2, 3 and 5.

Whereas it has been represented to His Excellency the Governor that it is desirable in the public interest to widen, improve and realign the public road between Nicosia and the junction to Larnaca on the Nicosia-Famagusta Road (known as Kalopsida Junction) by stages as may from time to time be decided (hereinafter referred to as "the road"):

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, His Excellency the Governor does hereby declare the widening, improving and realigning of the road to be an undertaking of public utility, and does hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking, under the provisions of the said Law, and does hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Director of Public Works.
