THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1956.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Modification of the Criminal Procedure Law) Regulations, 1956.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 45 of the Criminal Procedure Law, or in any Rules of Court made under the said Law, where a summons has been issued by a Judge or Justice of the Special Court, a certificate of service endorsed on a copy thereof under the hand of the person effecting service shall be *prima facie* evidence of the service of such summons.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2876

MADE UNDER SECTION 124 (1).

*Authority to the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Paphos
to contract a loan.*

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 124 (1) of the Municipal Corporations Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. The Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Councillors and Townsmen of the Municipal Corporation of Paphos (hereinafter referred to as "the Municipal Corporation") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lender") the sum of five thousand pounds (£5,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say :—

(a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Municipal Corporation to the Lender in ten equal annual instalments (comprising
