### THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1956.

#### REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

JOHN HARDING,

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Amendment of the Elementary Education Law) Regulations, 1956.

2. During the continuance in force of these Regulations the sections of the Elementary Education Law specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be read and construed as if they were respectively amended in the manner shown in the second column of the said Schedule.

25. Failure to perform duties.	Insert immediately after the words " Board of Education ", where they twice occur in lines 6 and 10, the words " or any person authorized by the Governor in that behalf ".
86. Government grants for certain purposes.	Add the following proviso thereto (the full stop at the end thereof being substituted by a colon) :— " Provided that where the Governor has authorized, under section 25 of this Law, any person to perform all or any of the duties vested in a Town Committee or Village Commission or Committee of Management, the Governor may direct that no grant shall be paid under this section in any school year in respect of any school for the general management and supervision of which such Town Committee or Village Commission or Committee of Management is responsible ".

90 (4). Assessments for Schools situate in villages.	<p>Add the following additional proviso thereto (the full stop at the end thereof being substituted by a colon) :—</p> <p>“ Provided further that where the Governor has authorized, under section 25 of this Law, any person to perform all or any of the duties vested in a Village Commission or Committee of Management this sub-section shall have effect as if for the reference to the 15th day of October in each year there were substituted a reference to the 15th day of December in each year ”.</p>

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 12) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 11) 1956 (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Regulations ”) and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 12) 1956.

2. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 43, of the following new Regulation :—

43A. (1) No person shall make, print, publish, sell or expose for sale, any photograph, or any other reproduction whatsoever, of any person who has been convicted of an offence against Regulation 52 of these Regulations.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.”
