THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS) REGULATIONS, 1956

NOTICE (No. 4) UNDER CLAUSE 3 OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

The import into the Colony by any importer registered under the provisions of the Defence (Registration of Importers and Resellers) Order, 1954, of the goods shown in the List hereunder from Yugoslavia is hereby permitted without a written licence under regulation 3 (1) (a) of the above-named Regulations, subject to the following terms and conditions :—

- (a) that payment for such goods shall be made in sterling ;
- (b) that such goods shall originate in and be imported from Yugoslavia ;
- (c) that such goods shall be cleared from Customs on or before the 31st January, 1957.
