THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER) REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 17) 1956.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 44.

Whereas it appears to me to be expedient in the interest of public order and safety to take possession of the premises described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the premises") and to authorise its use in the interest of public order and safety:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by Regulation 44 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations 1955 to (No. 17) 1956, which I have been authorised to exercise under Notification No. 736 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 26th November, 1955, I, the Commissioner of Nicosia and Kyrenia, have taken possession of the premises with effect from 28th November, 1956, and in connection with the taking, possession and making use of the premises, I hereby direct and order as follows :--

- (1) The use of the premises for the requirements of Her Majesty's Forces is hereby authorised.
- (2) The persons using the premises in pursuance of this Order are hereby authorised to do, in relation to the premises, anything which any person having an interest in the premises would be entitled to do by virtue of that interest.
- (3) The exercise of any right of way over the premises, and of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person, whether by virtue of an interest in the premises or otherwise, is hereby prohibited.

SCHEDULE.

The privately owned premises with all appurtenances known as "Thalia Hotel", situate at Lapithos village, Kyrenia District, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Commissioner of Nicosia and Kyrenia and deposited in his office at Nicosia.

THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955. Laws 17 and 47 of 1955.

Order made under Section 2.

2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Nicosia or the Assistant Chief Constable in charge of the area:

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 30th day of January, 1957.

THE CURFEWS LAWS, 1955. Laws 17 and 47 of 1955.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Curfews Laws, 1955, and delegated to me under section 2A of the said Laws by Notification No. 666 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th July, 1956, I do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Curfews (Nicosia District No. 8) Order, 1957.

2. No person within the area prescribed in the First Schedule hereto shall be out of doors between the hours prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Commissioner of Nicosia or the Assistant Chief Constable in charge of the area :

Provided that this Order shall not apply to any member of the Executive Council, Her Majesty's Forces, or the Cyprus Police Force.

This Order shall come into force on the 30th day of January, 1957.
