THE CUSTOMS MANAGEMENT LAWS 1954 TO 1957.
ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2990

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 42 of the Customs Management Laws, 1954 to 1957, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Prohibited Imports) (Firearms Books) Order, 1957.

2. The importation into the Colony of any book or other publication giving instructions regarding the construction, operation, maintenance or care of any firearm as defined in the Firearms Law, other than a harpoon gun used for fishing purposes, is hereby prohibited.

3. This order shall not apply to books or publications imported by Her Majesty's Forces, the Police Force or any department of Government.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 5) 1957.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 44.

Whereas it appears to the Governor to be expedient in the interest of public order and safety to take possession of the land described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the land") and to authorise its use in the interest of public order and safety :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Regulation 44 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 5) 1957, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to take possession of the land and, in connection with the taking possession and making use of the land, has been pleased to direct and order as follows:—

- (1) The use of the land for the requirements of Her Majesty's Forces is hereby authorized.
- (2) The persons using the land in pursuance of this Order are hereby authorised to do, in relation to the land, anything which any person having an interest in the land would be entitled to do by virtue of that interest.
- (3) The exercise of any right of way over the land, and of any other right relating thereto which is enjoyed by any person, whether by virtue of an interest in the land or otherwise, is hereby prohibited.

SCHEDULE.

All that area of privately-owned land in the Kamanderena locality of Stroumbi village, Paphos District, being Plot Nos. 478/2, 481/2, 481/3/1, 481/1/2, 482/1, 482/2, 483 and 484 on the Government Survey SH/PL. No. XLV.13 and more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Commissioner of Paphos and dated 17th January, 1957, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Office of the Commissioner of Paphos.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL
POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE
REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 28th January, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 2nd February, 1956, under Notification No. 73 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order situated at Katholiki Quarter, Limassol (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 642, 1284 and 711 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 12th July, 1956, 28th December, 1956 and 18th July, 1957, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 27th January, 1958;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1957), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorisation for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 28th January, 1958, and the Order is so extended accordingly.
